WHO WE ARE

Open Hands charity supports people in need in Leicester with emergency practical help, skills training, and mentoring. Every week more than 400 people access help through our Compassion Centre in the St. Matthews estate in Leicester, supported by our amazing team of over 100 volunteers! We love to go the extra mile, showing love to people through everything we do. Together with your support, we offer care, dignity, and hope for the future to everyone we meet.

The clients we help are known internally as guests. We help a broad range of different people including low-income families, people who are homeless, refugees and asylum seekers and people who are unemployed. The term 'guest' is used to emphasise how we welcome everyone we meet; we value individuals for who they are rather than their circumstances. We support individuals at their point of need and then walk with people on a journey towards living

independently.

OURHSTORY

Open Hands Trust was founded in 2006 by Trinity Life Church (now One Church Leicester) and started with opening our first preschool in Highfields. Two years later, it became clear there was a need to serve the local community in other practical ways too.

We help people experiencing food poverty through three different ways. For those who are homeless and those with limited access to cooking facilities, we offer 'Pie Night', a free hot meal served on Tuesday evenings. For individuals with no financial means to pay for food or toiletries, we offer free crisis support through our Food Store. For individuals with a limited income but without the means to pay for full supermarket prices, we offer visits to our Social Supermarket, our affordable shopping service. Through our shop individuals gain confidence in choosing food for themselves, starting to think about meal planning and budgeting, helping them on the journey towards managing their food needs independently.

ESSENTALS



Our drop-in mornings provide practical support to individuals in need of emergency, clothing, bedding and household items. Individuals are supported in finding the items they need by a wonderful team of volunteers and thanks to the kindness of our donors. Individuals are given choice and dignity through the service as we seek to always provide items that add value to someone's life and express our love and care for people. Our teams are experienced in active listening and providing emotional support in every interaction, ensuring no-one feels alone, and helping to signpost individuals to additional support where needed.

FURNITURE



Our furniture service supports recently housed refugees and homeless individuals and low-income households with free or low-cost essential furniture. 98% of social housing tenant homes are not furnished*, and so our aim is to help those who arrive in an empty space to be able to transform their house into a home. We deliver a personal service through offering referred individuals appointments that give the time for us to listen and help to meet their needs in a meaningful way. Individuals can choose their own furniture according to their need, preference and finances. We also work alongside the council to deliver furniture to community support grant holders as part of the Leicestershire and Rutland Re-use Network.

ENGLISH CLASSES



Our classes provide a safe community for asylum seekers, refugees and other adult learners to improve their English language and communication skills. We offer 7 different ability classes to suit a range of needs, from basic conversation classes all the way up to **International English Language Testing** System (IELTS) level to help individuals into further education and employment. Coupling the care we give with the skills students learn helps individuals to build new friendships, gain confidence in meeting new people, and learn skills that are useful in integrating into the wider community.
